GOBLE FAMILY REUNION - 2013

The original site for the 2013 Goble Family Reunion was to be on the shores of New Jersey, not far from the historical sites we all love. Since the horrific storm Sandy did much to destroy the shoreline of New Jersey and the hotels we were considering, we have to alter the location of the event.

We have selected Morristown New Jersey to be our Goble hub in 2013! The date has been set for <u>June 21-23</u> with our main conference taking place on Saturday June 22nd at the Best Western Morristown Inn, 270 South Street in the heart of downtown Morristown.

This very nice hotel is conveniently located and is providing us a discount on rooms (\$95 + taxes per night). We have reserved a block of 25 rooms at this time. Rooms must be booked no later than the 21st of May. Reservations made after the 21st may not be at the special rate. Cancelation of rooms will be accepted no later than May 21st. The nearest airport is Newark. There is no shuttle to the hotel, but there is taxi service should you choose not to rent a car. There is adequate parking at the hotel for guests at no charge.

Nearby attractions include: Acorn Hall; Washington's Headquarters Museum; Frelinghuysen Arboretum; Morris Museum; Schuyler Hamilton House; Morristown City Hall; and Community Theater.

We will gather on Friday evening, June 21st and set up our display tables of family artifacts. The name of the room will be posted in the lobby. On Saturday we will gather for our meeting by 9:00am. We are planning a buffet lunch about 12:00 that will be followed by a short break and reconvene for our meeting by 1:30pm. We will try to break for the day by 4:00pm and will have the evening for exploring Morristown on our own. Sunday morning we will meet after breakfast for a tour of historic Morristown.

Cost of the reunion will be \$50 per person (age 12 and above) and \$25 for children ages 3 to 11 years. It will include a Hot Luncheon Buffet on Saturday.

For those interested in the history tour we plan to visit the First Baptist Church of Morristown (20 minute walk or short drive); Acorn Hall where the Morristown Historical

Society is located; Washington's Headquarters Museum; Wick House-Jockey's Hollow; and we will try to find Robert (4) Goble's home.

We plan to order Goble t-Shirts as we have in the past so the **attached form** will include a space for you to let us know if you want one!

The home of Robert (4) Goble is located at 434 Mt. Kemble Ave., Morristown, New Jersey. There was very likely a family cemetery located near the rear of the home. The Robert Goble

house was occupied in 1905 by John S. Green and in 1974 the house belonged to Michael Sarinelli. Directions: MT. Kemble Avenue is off Morristown Green. One and 1/2 to 2 miles on the left, about 200 feet before Sand Spring Road. ¹
